aHUS Algorithms - What Is That?

Did you know there are several tools physicians can use to help diagnose atypical HUS? These <u>aHUS/TMA algorithms</u> are available as an assist to foster more rapid and accurate diagnoses. As step-by-step flowcharts such algorithms have been developed to guide medical teams as they sort out whether a patient has aHUS or another condition with similar symptoms. These algorithms have been available for several years - so why is 'delayed diagnosis' still a reality within aHUS patient experiences?

Closing the CaHUS Knowledge Gap

While there's still debate among experts considering changes to address confusion caused by wide variations in aHUS terminology, one thing remains clear. There's also great variety among how aHUS affects patients in terms of severity, duration of aHUS activity, and organs affected.

A recent UK study of characteristics and clinical experiences of 300+ CaHUS (complement mediated/associated HUS) patients has been compiled in a UK database maintained by the aHUS expert center in Newcastle upon Tyne. <u>Read</u> <u>Why</u> this is of such broad importance.

aHUS & Compromised Immunity

Some degree of being 'immunocompromised' (weakened immune system) has been a long-held premise for those who've experienced atypical HUS episodes, as well as for people with a genetic predisposition to have aHUS trigger at some point during their life. We still have much to discover about how aHUS activity is triggered, and why part of a patient's immune system loses its ability to self-regulate. There's a new initiative underway that globally bonds across different diseases, read more <u>HERE</u>.
